School Expectations and Attitudes

1. Attendance and Punctuality

Student Duties:

- Attend school every day as scheduled on the academic calendar.
- Be present at the morning assembly and all classes on time.
- Complete assignments missed during absence.
- Remain at school during school hours unless officially permitted to leave.

Parent Duties:

- Ensure children attend school daily and arrive on time.
- Notify the school of any absence.
- If using school transport, inform the bus supervisor and Heads of Department (HODs) before the bus arrives.
- If not using transport, notify HODs directly.

Late Arrivals:

- Students arriving after 7:40 a.m. must enter through the main gate.
- Repeated lateness (3 times) will result in a formal warning letter.
- Persistent lateness may involve further disciplinary action.

Early Dismissals:

- Parents must request permission in advance via the Head of Section or school reception (info@royalschool.ae).
- A doctor's appointment confirmation must be shown if leaving for medical reasons.
- Holidays during term are not permitted.

School Procedures for Absence (per ADEK policy):

- 1. All absences are recorded in the ESIS system.
- 2. Parents are automatically notified via SMS.
- 3. Excused and unexcused absences are noted separately.
- 4. Exceeding 6 unexcused absences may lead to grade penalties.
- 5. Excessive absence may affect re-enrollment.

2. Break Time Rules

To ensure a safe and enjoyable environment, students must:

- Spend break time in supervised areas only.
- Avoid staying in classrooms during break.

- Stop play immediately when the bell rings and proceed quietly to assembly.

- Avoid pushing, crowding, or unsafe behavior.
- Use handrails on stairs and avoid jumping.
- Proceed directly to classrooms without loitering.

5. Parent and Visitor Communication

Parents are encouraged to:

- Respect school values and rules.
- Communicate constructively with teachers and leaders.
- Schedule meetings when needed.
- Support children in correcting poor behavior.
